The Elizabeth line, due to open in 2021, is named in honour of Queen Elizabeth II. How many crowns can you find hidden on the page?

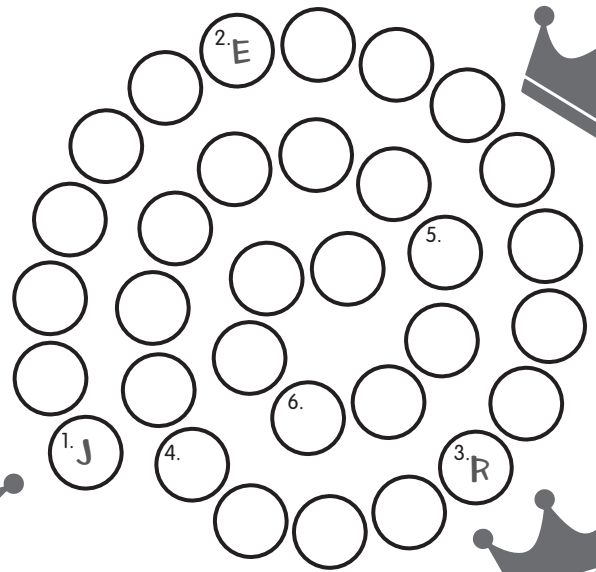

- 3 Their favourite transport doesn't float

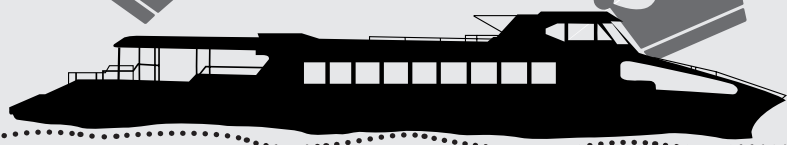
Many workers in Canary Wharf float their way to work – on river buses! It's a calm way to travel, with great riverbank views along the way.
